

Program Aide Award For Girl Scout Cadettes

Follow these steps to earn the award:

- Earn a Cadette Leadership in Action badge by helping a Brownie troop earn a journey. This step must be completed **BEFORE** you begin your leadership hours.



- Complete GSNCA's Program Aide Training.
- Help plan and lead at least six activity sessions for younger Girl Scouts (Juniors or below). Each activity session must last at least an hour, plus planning time. You should be taking the lead during these sessions, not just passing out supplies or helping someone else lead an activity they already planned.
- All leadership hours must be completed by September 30th after the Girl Scout enters 9th grade to earn this award.
- Submit your completed/signed Program Aide Report to awards@girlscoutsnca.org.
- Congratulations on earning the Program Aide Award! After receiving your approved application, your award pin will be mailed to you at the address provided on your final report form. Pins are included in the training registration fee and sent once award requirements are completed.
